Another Account of the Creation

In the day that the Lord God made the earth and the heavens, ⁵ when no plant of the field was yet in the earth and no vegetation of the field had yet sprung up—for the Lord God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was no one to till the ground, ⁶ but a stream would rise from the earth and water the whole face of the ground— ⁷ then the Lord God formed man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being. ⁸ And the Lord God planted a garden in Eden, in the east, and there he put the man whom he had formed. ⁹ Out of the ground the Lord God made to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food, the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

¹⁰ A river flows out of Eden to water the garden, and from there it divides and becomes four branches. ¹¹ The name of the first is Pishon; it is the one that flows around the whole land of Havilah, where there is gold, ¹² and the gold of that land is good; bdellium and onyx stone are there. ¹³ The name of the second river is Gihon; it is the one that flows around the whole land of Cush. ¹⁴ The name of the third river is Tigris, which flows east of Assyria. And the fourth river is the Euphrates.

¹⁵ The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it.



Care for Creation with Compost!

In honor of Creation Care Sunday, the Earth Care Committee has installed a compost bin outside the kitchen door near the trash bins. Bring your table scraps to church anytime and deposit them in the marked bin.

Wait, what is composting?

Composting is the process of recycling organic matter, such as food scraps, into fertilizer to enrich the soil.

Why should I bother with this?

- ⇒ Composting reduces waste. Many items that would usually be thrown away can be composted instead.
- ⇒ Compost can be added to gardens to enrich the soil. This reduces the need for synthetic fertilizers.
- ⇒ Plants grown in compost-rich soil tend to be more resistant to diseases and pests, reducing the need for pesticides.
- ⇒ Adding compost to gardens helps improve the soil. This adds more nutrients to crops, resulting in healthier food.
- ⇒ Composting helps conserve water. Adding organic matter to soil increases its water-retaining abilities, reducing the need for watering.
